In addition to a general benefit, we have further committed that the 9b Group shall pursue a specific benefit of **preserving or improving the environment** and advancing sustainable agriculture.

In the two-year period covered by this biennial report, 2020 and 2021, we pursued both our general and specific benefit by and through our work to achieve policy changes in Washington, most notably through working with the Administration and Congress. We worked to secure and increase funding for critical conservation programs, while seeking vital administrative program reforms to simplify processes and expand local voices. We also worked to ensure there was enhanced cooperation between individuals, entities, and the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA); particularly with the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). In addition, 9b continued assisting clients apply for grants and special projects. All lobbying and consulting work was designed to advance sustainable agriculture and foster a more inclusive, participatory environment.

2020-2021 BENEFIT YEARS IN REVIEW

We are proud of the positive impact we were able to obtain during our sixth and seventh years of operation. Throughout 2020 and 2021 we worked with our clients to pursue funding to advance farmland preservation, water quality, source water protection, precision ag conservation technology, and equitable access to programs for all producers.



OUR WORK

With over 50 years of field experience in developing and implementing agricultural conservation programs, 9b knows what it takes to make programs work. In close consultation with our clients, we helped them develop sound, implementable policy recommendations that would advance voluntary, incentive based private land conservation using Federal Programs. Overall, the recommendations sought

policy changes to increase funding for key conservation programs, increase implementation of source water protection measures, improve existing conservation programs, and foster the inclusion of underserved producers in conservation programs.

Much of our activity focused on working with Administration officials and Congressional staff to implement the conservation provisions in the 2018 Farm
Bill, improve existing program
delivery on critical resource
needs, and assist clients in
developing and successfully
obtaining grants and partnership
agreements. To obtain these
results, our team committed
significant amounts of time
researching and writing
proposals, working with a
wide diversity of partners,
coordinating with Federal
officials, and engaging Capitol Hill
decisionmakers.

THE RESULTS OF OUR WORK

Although we were just one of many groups and individuals who worked on developing the 2018 Farm Bill alongside the dedicated House and Senate Agriculture Committee Members and Staff, the results of that work began to be seen in 2019.

The successful effort to mandate that 10% of all the funding in the Agricultural Easement Program, Conservation Stewardship Program, Environmental Quality Incentives Program and the Regional Conservation Partnership Program be spent on Source Water Protection bore amazingly positive results. In 2019 the amount of funding obligated in these four programs toward source water protect totaled \$365.1 million. In 2020, the amount rose to \$459.6 million.

Similarly, the successful work with other entities to increase the funding for the Agricultural Conservation Easement Program from \$250 million to \$450 million per year, increase the Regional Conservation Partnership Program from \$100 million to \$300 million per year, and permanently authorize \$50 million per year for the Watershed Protection and Flood Prevention Program resulted in significant increases in critically important conservation projects.

Below are some key examples of 9b's work with client to achieve sustainable agriculture, enhanced water quality, improved wildlife habitat, strengthened equitable access to federal conservation program, and increased understanding of the natural resource and food production issues facing the Nation today:

\$824 MILLION

TO PROTECT SOURCE WATER

Funding obligated in 2019 and 2020 to protect source water

\$7.4 **MILLION**

FOR A PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP GRANT IN ARKANSAS TO RESTORE PREVIOUSLY DRAINED WETLANDS TO NATURAL CONDITIONS WITH THE GOAL OF ADDRESSING CLIMATE CHANGE THROUGH CARBON SEQUESTRATION.

Permanent easements will be used to restore marginal cropland to its previous forested condition. Arkansas has a substantial backlog of producers interested in wetland easements and this project will focus on limited resource farmers who have often been left out of conservation programs.

\$2.1 **MILLION**

IN THE JAMES RIVER HEADWATERS IN MISSOURI TO LEVERAGE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE RESOURCES TO SUPPORT THE PROTECTION OF CLEAN DRINKING WATER FOR MORE THAN 150,000 MISSOURIANS, IMPROVE THE LOCAL FARMING ECONOMY, HELP THE LOCAL MUNICIPALITY AND COUNTY TO MEET FEDERAL WATER QUALITY REQUIREMENTS, AND IMPROVE AQUATIC ECOSYSTEMS.

Project partners plan to triple conservation implementation in the watershed and build an innovative legal and functional framework for the investment of municipal funding on upstream private lands to reduce water quality impacts downstream.

\$6.5 MILLION IN WYOMING TO HELP ADVANCE EFFORTS TO PRESERVE MIGRATORY PATHS FOR THE ESTIMATED 75,000 BIG GAME ANIMALS IN THE GREATER YELLOWSTONE REGION BY PROTECTING INTACT AND CONNECTED MIGRATION CORRIDORS AND CRUCIAL WINTER RANGES.

Using state-of-the-art GPS collar data, scientists can help target project funding to the most critical properties for big game migration. Project partners will help implement four landowner activities—entity-held easements, an innovative payment-forecosystem services land lease, fence modification, and invasive species control.

\$6.8 MILLION IN NEW HAMPSHIRE TO PROTECT HIGH PRIORITY SOURCE WATER AREAS, RESTORE HABITAT FOR THREATENED FISH AND WILDLIFE SPECIES, AND ENHANCE CLIMATE RESILIENCE.

The twelve project partners plan to take advantage of RCPP flexibilities including forest land easements to execute large, multi-faceted projects in at least 25 targeted small watersheds.

\$3.5 MILLION IN SONOMA COUNTY CALIFORNIA FOR A MULTI-OBJECTIVE PROJECT CENTERED ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF INNOVATIVE RIPARIAN CORRIDOR CONSERVATION EASEMENTS AND SOURCE WATER PROTECTION FORESTLAND EASEMENTS.

The easements will preserve agricultural lands, help reduce regulatory burdens, restore riparian and forest ecosystems, improve habitat for at-risk and T & E species, protect source water (both surface and ground), and improve community resilience to extreme events including catastrophic wildfire and flooding.

\$8 MILLION FOR THE LAKE SEBAGO WATERSHED IN MAINE. THIS LAKE PROVIDES DRINKING WATER TO ONE SIXTH OF MAINE'S POPULATION, YET ONLY 11 PERCENT OF THIS WATERSHED IS CURRENTLY PROTECTED FROM DEVELOPMENT.

The project will work with landowners and local municipalities to protect 10,000 acres of forest, improve aquatic organism passageway, restore wetlands, improve forest management, control aquatic invasive plant species, and educate landowners. Success for this project will include maintaining water quality levels, protection of critical forests, and spatial analysis of biodiversity.

\$1.3 MILLION TO PREVENT NUTRIENTS AND SEDIMENT FROM ENTERING LAKE SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS, PROTECTING THE SOURCE WATERS UPON WHICH 165,000 PEOPLE DEPEND.

The project will focus on targeted outreach and practice implementation at locations in the watershed generating the greatest per acre, nitrogen, phosphorus and sediment loads and will be guided by the 2017 Lake Springfield Watershed Management Plan, with a goal of delisting the Lake from the 303(d) impaired waters list.

\$375 MILLION

FOR A NRCS INITIATIVE

Drafted a special NRCS Initiative in the Prairie Pothole Region for wildlife, wetland protection, and climate mitigation.

Over 2020 and 2021, the 9b Group continued to provide pro bono assistance to a wide variety of groups and individuals. Examples include:

Served as a volunteer Board Member for the Pollinator Partnership, a small non-profit dedicated to preserving and enhancing all pollinators

Provided counsel to small firm seeking to improve the technical infrastructure of the crop insurance program

Provide counsel to small biological firm on how to increase in-stream monitoring in NRCS projects

Assisted a land trust in developing a proposal to place a permanent easement on a working farm that otherwise would have been turned into a subdivision
